Her work, *Sultana’s Dream*, is a feminist utopian novel that imagines a world where women are the dominant gender and men are confined to a small, walled-in area. The novel is set in a world where women have achieved equality and are the primary producers and consumers of goods and services. The novel is a critique of the patriarchal system and the imperialist project. (C, I)
